

USB 3.0 Internal Bay Multi Card Reader/eSATA Quick Installation Guide

Introduction

The *USB 3.0 Internal Bay Multi Card Reader/ eSATA* is the perfect choice for computer users looking for a multi-format flash memory card reader/writer that installs into a front drive bay of the computer.

Layout




Figure 1: Layout

Insert/Activity LED

This LED will be on whenever a memory card is inserted. The LED will blink when a memory card is accessed.

USB 3.0 Port

A convenient front access USB 3.0 port. Plug any USB device into this port.

eSATA Port

A convenient front access eSATA port. Plug any eSATA device into this port.

USB 3.0 20-pin Header

Plugs into the motherboard's USB 3.0 20-pin Header using the included USB 3.0 20-pin to 20-pin cable. The cable's 20-pin connector, shown below, is keyed to ensure proper installation.

Motherboard's USB 3.0 20-pin Header

The motherboard's **USB 3.0 20-pin Header** consists of 19 pins arranged in 2 rows. Make sure the **Cut out** on the motherboard's USB 3.0 20-pin Header is aligned with the **Tab** on the USB 3.0 cable's 20-pin connector, see **Figure 2** on page 4 for more information or refer to your system's users manual for proper installation.

WARNING

Note: Connecting the USB 3.0 cable's **20-pin Connector** to your motherboard's **USB 3.0 20-pin Header** improperly will damage your system.

Hardware Installation

Important: In order for the *USB 3.0 Internal Bay Multi Card Reader/eSATA* to work properly, the driver of your existing USB 3.0 host adapter and SATA controller must be installed properly.

- 1. Turn OFF the power to your computer and all connected peripheral devices.
- 2. Unplug the power cord from the computer.
- 3. Remove the computer cover.
- 4. Select an available 3.5" drive bay for mounting the card reader, remove the cover plate from the selected drive bay.
- 5. Insert one end of the included SATA data cable into the card reader's SATA connector.
- 6. Insert one end of the included USB 3.0 data cable into the card reader's USB 3.0 20-pin

- 7. Insert the card reader into the drive bay and secure it by using the supplied mounting screws.
- 8. Insert the other end of the SATA data cable into the computer's SATA connector.
- 9. Insert the other end of the USB 3.0 data cable into the motherboard's USB 3.0 20-pin Header. Align the **Tab** on the cable's 20-pin connector with the **Cut out** on the motherboard's 20-pin header and press firmly, yet gently for a solid connection, see **Figure 3** on page 5 for more information.

Driver Installation

Windows will detect and install the drivers for the *USB 3.0 Internal Bay Multi Card Reader/eSATA* automatically. No additional driver installation is needed.

To Verify Windows Installation

1. Check **Device Manager** to verify successful installation.

<u>Windows 7 / Server 2008 R2</u>: Right click Computer, click Manage, then click Device Manager.

<u>Windows Vista</u>: Right click **Computer**, click **Manage**, click **Continue**, then click **Device Manager**.

<u>Windows XP / Server 2003 / 2000</u>: Right click **My Computer**, click **Manage**, then click **Device Manager**.

Windows Server 2008: Right click Computer, click Manage, double click Diagnostics, then click Device Manager.

- 2. Double click **Universal Serial Bus controllers**, **USB Mass Storage Device** should be displayed, in addition to others that may come with your system.
- 3. Double click **Disk drives**, **Generic... USB Device** should be displayed five times.

Using the Card Reader

To prevent damage to the card reader or memory card, please read this section.

Inserting Memory Cards

Insert your memory card with the pins facing forward and the top label facing up.

Accessing Memory Cards

For Windows 7 / Server 2008 R2: A Removable Disk icon will appear in Computer only when a memory card is inserted into the memory card slot. Otherwise, no Removable Disk icons will appear in Computer. If you prefer to have the disk icons appear, regardless, follow the steps below.

- 1. Double click **Computer**, click **Organize**, click **Folder and search options**.
- 2. Select the **View** tab, uncheck **Hide empty** drives in the Computer folder.
- 3. Click **OK** to save the changes.

For other Windows OS: Five **Removable Disk** icons will appear in **Computer/My Computer**. The memory card's volume name will appear when inserted, double click the disk icon that corresponds to the inserted memory card.

Removing Memory Cards

To prevent data loss, data corruption or memory card failure, **do not** remove memory cards while the **Insert/Activity LED** is FLASHING.

Using the eSATA Port

eSATA devices come with their own accessories. In most cases you just need to power up the eSATA device and connect it to the port. For more information, refer to the device's manual.
